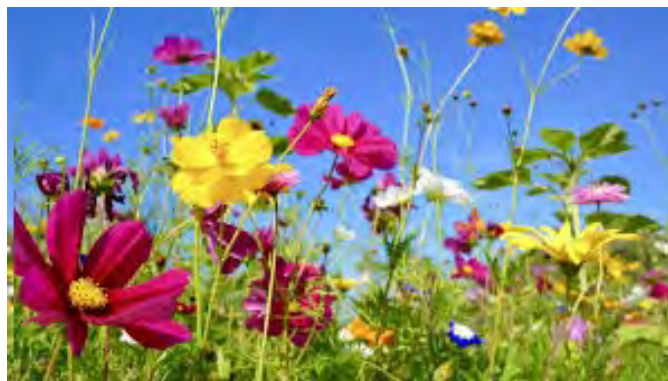
MAY BENCH REST MATCH
