ODFW's new Electronic Licensing System (ELS)


ODFW's new electronic licensing system will allow customers to store their licenses, tags and validations online on their smart phone or tablet. Customers can also choose to carry paper documents, but will be able to purchase and print these documents from home using regular paper. The new system will also allow for electronic tagging of fish and game using an app that will work even when offline.

The Glitch in the MyODFW app that affected the ability to tag fish offline was fixed. The Android MyODFW update became available about 9 a.m. on Jan. 3. Go to the Google Play store on your Android phone to update your app if you haven't already.

The updated MyODFW app for iPhone has been pushed to the Apple app store but is still not available as of 4 p.m. Friday, Jan. 4 (app updates to the Apple store take longer). iPhone users should continue to check for the update by visiting the Apple App store from your phone.

Anglers/hunters with iPhones who are fishing or hunting in areas without cell service the next few days (so unable to report harvest on the app): please record your catch/harvest on paper or via the notes function on your device while you are offline. Upon your return to cell service, please tag your fish or animal immediately in the app.

Oregon State Police is aware of this issue and ODFW apologizes for this inconvenience. Thanks to all who chose e-tagging and for your patience with the new system.
