Responsibilities:

Preferred:

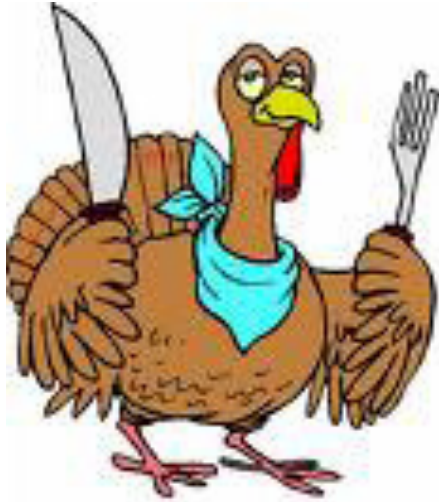
- Previous experience in property maintenance and caretaking

The winner of each squad will receive a turkey, bacon or ham. Winners of each squad then move to the 25 yard line for further competition. Maximum Wins of 4 per individual. Anyone who does not win will receive a turkey, ham or an equivalent prize. This event is open to club members and the general public.



Trap shooting: Douglas High School team takes second in state championships

The Douglas High School trap team turned in a banner 2025 season, highlighted by a runner-up finish in the Oregon state championships. It was the highest finish ever in the event for the club team, which was comprised of 19 student-athletes ages 12-18 from seven different schools around Douglas County this year.

Yamhill-Carlton, the defending national champion, won the state tournament varsity team crown which was held June 21-22 at the Hillsboro Trap and Skeet Club. Forty-two teams and 1,077 shooters took part at state. Douglas, in its seventh year as a club team, had 10 shooters qualify for the state tourney. “We were excited about how the kids performed,” said Curt Stookey, one of the volunteer coaches of the

Douglas team. “All that hard work came together. The weather was nasty, but the kids hung in there and shot some really good scores. Trap shooting is a shotgun sport where clay targets, or “clay pigeons” are launched away from the angles. The shooter aims to break the target with a shotgun shell, with the goal of hitting as many targets as possible within a round. It’s a popular recreational and competitive activity enjoyed by people of all ages and abilities.

Douglas started practice in March, using the Roseburg Rod & Gun Club. Stookey said they held two practices a week during the season, trying to accommodate the kids’ schedules. “The kids really enjoy it,” Stookey said. “It’s something anybody can do.” Jeffrey Humphrey, a Roseburg High student, led Douglas at state. He tied for third individually in the varsity male division, shooting 96 out of 100. Sam Long, from Glide, tied for 10th with 93 out of 100. Tristin Stout of Rainier achieved a perfect score of 100 to take first place. Other state competitors for Douglas included Ryder
